AGING WELL IS THE NEW THING

United Methodist SBC21 Brings Awareness to National Healthy Aging Month



(Dallas, TX 9/11/2023) - What comes to mind when you think about aging well? Is it a high quality of life as it relates to your independence? Or maybe it means you value being mentally intact; or could it be that having the mobility of your limbs? Whatever your why is, according to a recent CNN study, Americans will live longer - but in poor health!

The United Methodist Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century (SBC21) is observing National Healthy Aging Month with a 4-city tour entitled *Build a Better You*. The tour features a "Day Party with A Purpose" designed to bring awareness and resources to what it means to age well - mind, body and spirit. With stops in Atlanta, Birmingham, Houston and Dallas, organizers say

it will kick off the event with its partners from United Healthcare with a FREE Day Party for more than 300 persons, 1pm–3pm Sat. September 23. Rosa Parks once said, "To bring about change, you must not be afraid to take the first step. We will fail when we fail to try."

Our church took a major step forward on Sunday, September 10, when we talked about racism in America with Rev. Scott Gililand, pastor of Arapaho UMC, in "The Conversation." In case you do not know, "The Conversation," is an occasional Sunday morning event where we bring pressing issues to the congregation in a conversation format. The first one centered around the soaring use of Fentaynal.

Rev. Scott was very transparent on his perspectives as an Anglo, male, father, husband and pastor. I deeply appreciated his response to a question that burned in my soul about what seems to be a generational hatred of Black people. When the dialogue was over I felt better, not because we had solved the problem, but because my soul had been encouraged to press on, a little while longer.

Your church is committed to addressing racism via the North Texas Annu-

al Conference program called Journey Toward Racial Justice. It is led by Fred Marsh. Under his leadership our church and Arapaho have joined to walk this journey.

It should be noted that this is not the first time in the history of Hamilton Park UMC to join with an Anglo congregation and talk about racism. I suspect this will continue to happen until Jesus comes.

Please be aware that the entire Arapaho UMC congregation will be worshipping with us on November 12. Their campus is under repair at that time. This will be a full circle moment, in that we worshipped at their site when our campus was under construction.
