Church Family, the sermon I preached on last Sunday touched many of you. I received numerous positive comments on it. I take no credit for it. God led me to the scripture and poured out the message. The sermon was about change. Change is on the minds of many right now due to my upcoming retirement, and as we wait on the announcement of the interim and new pastor of our church.

Change can be an energizing force for power and progress, or, if not handled well can also be a force for stagnation and regression.

God has a recipe for change. It needs to be followed exactly. No modifications, please. My sermon was entitled, "God's Recipe for Change." Based on Joshua 1, the sermon examines change in the lives of the Children of Isreal.

Please take some time to read and meditate on Joshua 1: 1-11, 16-18. In this Old Testament scripture, Moses died, and God raised up Joshua to lead them. The people accepted Joshua as their leader, worked with him to move forward, and ultimately, they reached the Promise Land.

1. The PERSONNEL will change, but not the promises or the power.

Verses 5-6

God told them, "As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you. Be strong and courageous...."

2. Let each leader be who they are.

Moses and Joshua were different leaders, with different gifts. God knew what type of leader they needed to move ahead. The people trusted God.

3. WALK TOGETHER AND DON'T GET WEARY

Joshua asked the leaders to get busy working on the mission, and they did. Verses 10-11

10 So Joshua ordered the officers of the people: 11 "Go through the camp and tell the people, 'Get your provisions ready. Three days from now you will cross the Jordan here to go in and take possession of the land the Lord your God is giving you for your own."

I am certain that God's recipe will work here at our church. Let's continue to pray and stay together.

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Project Alpha Offers a Conference on Sexual Responsibility for the Youth



Local youth will have the opportunity to talk about issues of sexuality and male responsibility as they take part in a workshop sponsored by Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. The Project Alpha conference will be held on Saturday, January 13, at the Crosby Recreation Center in Carrollton, TX. The conference will run from 1:00PM-3:30 PM. Project Alpha is a national program, designed to help young men make better and more informed choices about their sexual behavior. Since 1980, Alpha Phi Alpha and the March of Dimes have been working together to help young men make the right deci-

sions about the complex issues surrounding sex. This is a unique mentoring program which offers African American men as positive role models for the next generation. Topics to be covered during the conference sessions may include abstinence and the consequences of early sexual activity; peer pressure; HIV/AIDS; teen pregnancy: STIs; relationships; being responsible parents. Project Alpha seeks to create a safe environment where teens can learn about and explore their sexuality and relationship issues. The program's three goals are:


1) Sharing Knowledge: combating ignorance and fear with information

2) Changing Attitudes: providing youth with the motivation they need to make positive changes in their sexual behaviors

3) Providing Skills: creating a sense of empowerment and self-esteem

The workshops are free and open to youth ages of 12 through 18. Pre-registration, however, is required for attendance.

Mental Illness and the CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

People with mental illness deserve help, not handcuffs. Yet people with mental illness are overrepresented in our nation's jails and prisons. We need to reduce criminal justice system involvement and increase investments in mental health care.



About 2 in 5 people who are incarcerated have a history of mental illness (37% in state and federal prisons and 44% held in local iails)

6% of women in son reported having istory of mental ass, almost twice percentage of men in prison.


ACCESS TO CARE
